

# Your Invited To Join Us For A Clean-Up Event September 20, 2008 9:30am until Noon At Taw Caw Park, Summerton



Beach Sweep/River Sweep—organized by S.C. Sea Grant Consortium in partnership with S.C. Department of Natural Resources—is the largest one-day litter cleanup of South Carolina’s beaches and waterways. Last year more than 6,000 South Carolinians helped collect 57 tons of trash and debris from nearly 1,345 miles of our waterways.



Beach Sweep/River Sweep benefits South Carolina’s environment, citizens, and visitors by:

- Removing unsightly and potentially harmful debris;
- Promoting stewardship in our communities
- Increasing awareness of the heavy toll litter takes on the economy and the environment; and educating people on the importance of recycling.



The Clarendon Conservation Youth Board adopted Taw Caw Park boat landing in 1997 as part of The Department of Natural Resources Adopt-a-Landing Program and has organized a Beach Sweep/River Sweep clean-up at the landing every year since. The Youth Board would like to invite all those who are interested in the stewardship of South Carolina’s waterways to come out on September 15th and participate in the event.
